Advisory note to this Bulletin No. 2

The organizers of the East African Safari Classic Rally (Safari Classic) have received reports that during the 2009 edition some competitors may have used pre-event cars to go over the route to provide extra information to their drivers one or two days in advance of the rally.

This is specifically forbidden under our regulations and the articles are copied below:

11.5 Reconnaissance is not permitted unless specifically allowed by the organizers. Pre-event cars sent to check the route are also strictly forbidden.

11.5.1 The use of any form of pace notes or any form of directional notes not supplied by the organizers is banned. Anyone found using such notes will be excluded from the event. There may be searches of the car and driver's luggage organized at random points to ensure compliance with this regulation.

The intent and spirit of this regulation is to create "a level playing field" for all competitors and it is not fair for any competitor to have more information about the route than what has been published by the organizers.

TEXT OF BULLETIN NO. 2

Add the following text to Article 11

11.5.2 The Clerk of Course will have additional security personal before the date of the route being used and these security crews will take photos and try to identify any advance car and find the link to the competitor concerned.

11.5.3 Any competitor or group of competitors who have been identified above will be disqualified by the Clerk of Course.

11.5.4 A further effort to control this event Road Books will be issued only two days before the planned running of the route.

11.5.5 Competitors can collect their Road Books for the "day after tomorrow" from the Rally Office upon arrival at the end of the Day as from 16h00 with any amendments for that Day. For the first day the Road Book will be issued on Friday 18th November from 16h00 onwards.
